CLASS: 1. **Vegetables** - LIMIT 6 different exhibits, only one per each variety. Each exhibit must be listed separately on entry form by species and variety (e.g. beans, snap, green; lettuce, leaf; tomatoes, etc.)
 2. **Funny Farm Art** – LIMIT 1 entry per exhibitor. Entries will be judged on humor and originality. GET CREATIVE – some ideas are: celery trees, banana cars, quilt stitched farmland with apples, squash birds, cucumber airplanes, etc. Entries must be mounted on 12" x 18" construction paper.

Note: Judges and Exhibitors. Appropriate check sheets issued by the Cooperative Extension Service should be used for judging these exhibits. Entry sheet must list the type of product (fruit, vegetable, preserves, etc.) and the method of process used. Low acid food must be canned under pressure. No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.

LIMIT: 3 entries per class. Each entry a different product or the same product preserved by a different method. Jar labels should list type of product and process used (i.e. Apricot Jam, pectin method; apricot halves, water bath processed).
