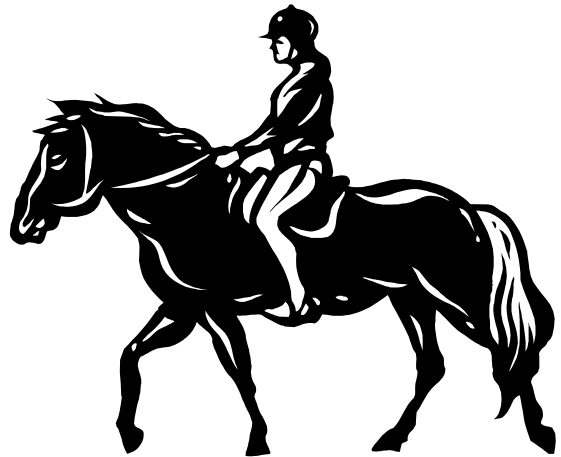

AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING

All entry forms must be complete and fees must be paid by entry closing date.

OPEN TO THE WORLD

All entry forms must be complete and fees must be in Fair Office or postmarked by Friday, Aug. 5, 2011 - NO POST ENTRIES

1. In order to properly identify the Exhibitor and Owner, please use the following:
 Owner- Owner of record of the Horse being shown. **Exhibitor-- Person actually showing the Horse.**
2. Photocopies of breed registration certificates must be sent in with entries. If original registration certificates are used, they must be presented to the Fair Office no later than 4:00 P.M., Wednesday, Aug 31, 2011.
3. Substitutions must be completed at least 24 hours before judging is scheduled to begin.
4. Fair reserves the right to split classes if needed
5. Stall fees: \$15.00 per stall (Draft Horses - \$15.00 per pen) must accompany entry form. No subletting. No refunds. Fair will assign stalls on first come basis. The Fair has very limited stalling so early entries will assure stalls.
6. Judging: Thursday, Sept. 1 in Jennifer Skuce Pavilion. 4-H Classes & Jr. Classes will be the first to show, Open Show starting with halter will follow in the afternoon.
7. Horses may leave grounds after judging of their classes.
8. **Drug Fee: \$5.00 per Horse or Mule.** Horses 6 months and younger are exempt.
9. American Horse Show Association Rules will apply at this show so long as they do not conflict with rules and regulations set forth by the Division of Fairs & Expositions.

AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING
4-H Equestrian Helmet Policy

All youth and adults participating in any 4-H equestrian activity, regardless of riding seat, shall wear properly fitted equestrian helmet, which meets ASTM/SEI approval. The helmet must be worn with secured chin harness properly fastened at all times when mounted on a horse or in a vehicle being pulled by one or more horses. It is recommended that helmets be worn at all times when handling any horse (i.e. grooming, clipping, and lunging).

It is the responsibility of the rider or the parent or guardian of the minor rider, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with such approval standards and carries the proper seals, and is properly fitted and in good condition. The University of California Cooperative Extension or Inter-Mountain Fair staff and agents are not responsible for checking headgear for compliance. The University of California or The Inter-Mountain Fair makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about such headgear and cautions riders that serious injury may result despite wearing headgear, as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries in equestrian sports.

At any time during a 4-H equestrian activity, the 4-H activity leader (i.e. Horse Show Manager, clinic organizer, club leader) may check a participant's helmet for proper standards. Individuals found to be wearing an unapproved or defective helmet will not be permitted to participate in any mounted or driving activity until a proper helmet is acquired.

NOTE: Horse or Ponies - Owned & ridden by 4-H Horse Project members wearing the 4-H Horse Showmanship Uniform. See Jr. Dept. Rules - 4-H Project Horses or Ponies may not be entered or ridden by anyone except the 4-H member in any Division of the Fair and must have been owned or leased by the Exhibitor for at least 120 days prior to the Fair.
