AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING

Limited to Shasta, Siskiyou, Modoc and Lassen Counties

- The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural products exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code, in order to be considered for premium awards.
- Section 42513: "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.
- Section 42515: "Overripe" means having an advanced state or maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
- All entries in these Divisions must have been home produced by the Exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
- Varietal of products must be adequately and correctly labeled.
- Varietal must be named on entry form.

DIVISION 173 - SPECIAL AGRICULTURAL DISPLAYS

CLASS: 1. Display of a raw agricultural product & at least two foods and/or crafts derived from original product. All home produced by the Exhibitor.

Display not to exceed 24" square. Each item to be labeled. Example Apple (raw product); applesauce, apple pie, etc.

2. Mosaic (please specify title of the mosaic on entry form) The mosaic is a one dimensional 3' X 3' artistic design or picture created with the use of grains, grasses, nuts, fruits and/or vegetables in their natural state and color. It can be a geometric, scenic or pictorial design. Example: a star, rolling hills, barn, etc. Construction materials may be used for outlining the design, i.e. bender board, cardboard, etc.

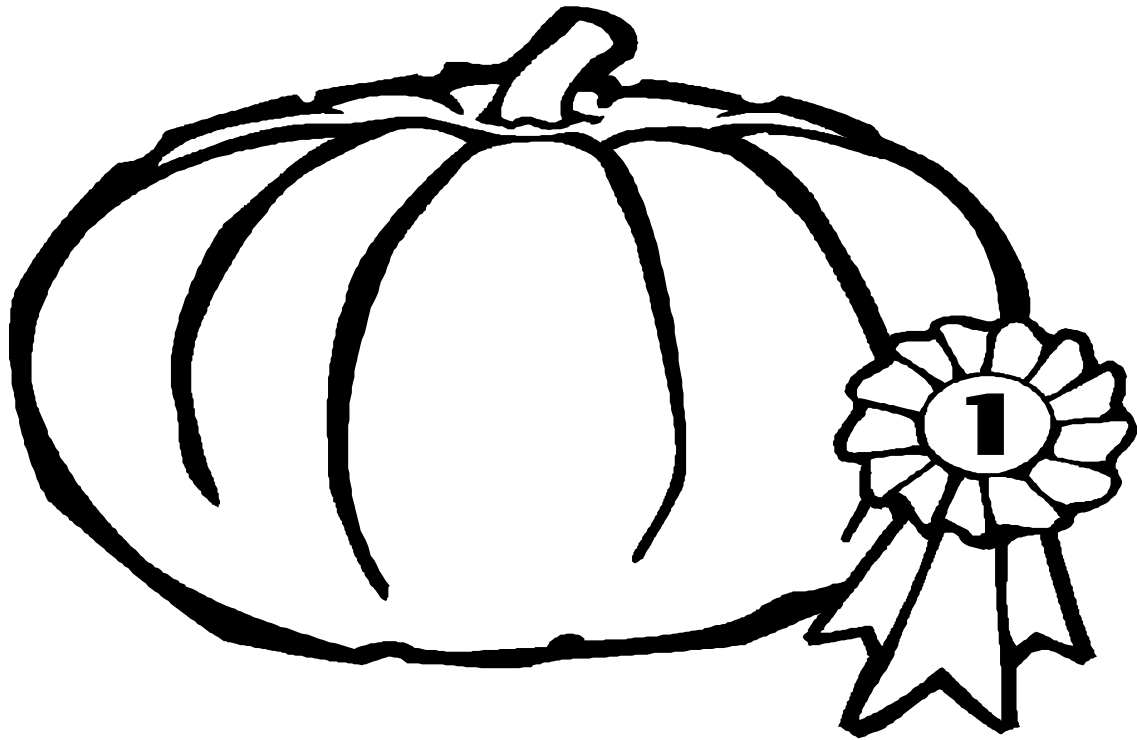
