## Division 182: Display of Border Plants

- Borders need to be cleaned at the end of growing season.
- Any decorations put in for judging must stay in place for the duration of Fair.
- Plants cannot exceed $31 / 2$ feet tall.
- Theme must be shown somewhere in your border.
